NOEL BROWN MEMORIAL FUND

At the General Meeting on the 23rd February, 1952, it was reported that a very handsome donation had been received from Lt.Com. I.E. Fisher, of Nottingham, to initiate the above fund.

The object of the fund, apart from that which its name implies, is to make available to the Committee at all times a sum of money quite separate from the ordinary funds of the Club, and which they may apply as they think fit from time to time for the sole purpose of assisting their keeper or keepers who may, after years of faithful service, by reason of old age, ill health, or infirmity, be no longer able to carry on with their job. It was particularly felt by the donor that this situation should be secured, regardless of the prosperity or otherwise of the Club's finances at the material time.

This most generous and spontaneous gesture on the part of Lt.Com. Fisher has done much to lighten the heavy burden of responsibility in this matter, which inevitably rests on the members of the Club as a whole.

After considerable discussion, it was agreed:-

- (1) That the Secretary should express to Lt.Com. Fisher, on behalf of the meeting, their very sincere appreciation of his gift.
- (2) That the fund should be vested in, and administered by, three Trustees, being the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer for the time being.
- (3) That as the majority of the members were not present at the meeting, the Secretary should specially notify all of them, not only to tell them what had been done, but also to express the hope that among the many other members who have enjoyed good sport at Kilnsey there will be some who will also wish to make some contribution.

Subsequently, and in accordance with the above and other decisions reached at the same meeting, this sum of money, augmented by a donation from the Club funds, has been suitably invested, quite separate from anything else, in the Halifax Building Society.
